

- CRANE, T. K.:** Attica, Ohio. *Ca.* 1886.
- CRANE, WILLIAM:** Born 1749. Died 1820. Canton, Mass. *Ca.* 1780. Stoughton, Mass. *Ca.* 1800. Clockmaker and brass founder. Father of Simeon Crane. Tall clocks. Watch paper.
- CRAVEN, ALFRED:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1843.
- CRAWFORD, JEREMIAH:** Born 1804. Red Sulphur, Monroe Co., W.Va. *Ca.* 1880. Watch fixer.
- CRAWFORD, WILLIAM:** Born 1745. Oakham, Mass. From Rutland, Mass. Excellent dwarf tall clocks. House still standing, with "clock room."
- CRAWLEY, ABRAHAM:** Roxbury, Mass. *Ca.* 1811-1813. Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1816-1818. Clockmaker. At Roxbury working for Simon Willard from 1811 to 1813 and alone from 1814 to 1815. In Boston from 1816 to 1818 at Pleasant and then Washington St.
- CRAWLEY, C.:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1829-1833.
- CRAWLEY JOHN:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1803-1826 at South Front St. and other addresses.
- CRAWLEY WATCH CASE CO., THE:** Newark, N.J. *Ca.* 1923.
- CREAK, WILLIAM:** Rhode Island. Tall clock.
- CREGYER, CHARLES:** Toledo, Ohio. *Ca.* 1875.
- CREHORE (CREHORES), CHARLES CRANE:** Born 1793. Died 1879. Milton, Dorchester Lower Mills, Roxbury, Mass. *Ca.* 1814-1828. Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1828-1879. Son of John Sheppard and Hannah Lyon Crehore. Clock case maker from about 1815. Cabinetmaker, musical instruments. Cases for S. Willard, Jr., B. F. Willard, Simon Willard, Elnathan Taber and others. To Boston in about 1828, 98 Charles St.; died Boston; no successor. Some list as Crehores, correct spelling Crehore.
- CREHORE, DANIEL S.:** Born 1804. Died 1841. Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1825-1841. Cabinetmaker. Journeyman cabinetmaker for William Fisk. Listed from 1831 to 1838 at same address as Fisk, 841 Washington. Estate included clock patterns, \$5.00.
- CREHORE, JOHN S.:** Born 1767. Died 1833. Milton, Mass. *Ca.* 1788-1828. Dedham, Mass. *Ca.* 1828-1833. Cabinetmaker.
- CREHORE, SAMUEL, SR.:** Born 1767. Died 1807. Dorchester, Mass. *Ca.* 1782-1807. Cabinetmaker.
- CREHORE, SAMUEL, JR.:** Born 1789. Died 1811. Roxbury, Mass. *Ca.* 1782-1807. Ornamental painter. Crehore painted 12 banjo clock tablets for cabinetmaker John Doggett in 1809.
- CREHORE, WILLIAM:** Born 1730. Died 1803. Milton, Mass. *Ca.* 1750-1803. Cabinetmaker.
- CREHORE, WILLIAM B.:** Born 1754. Died 1813. Milton, Mass. *Ca.* 1775 and later. Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1810-1813. Cabinetmaker and lumber merchant. Son of William Crehore.
- CREIGHTON:** See Bliss & Creighton.
- CREIGHTON, --?--:** Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1844-1855. Partner in Bliss & Creighton at 26 Merchants' Exchange in 1844-1846, continued at 7 Congress from 1847 to 1853. In Creighton & Black at both 7 Congress and New York City in 1854-1855. Chronometers.
- CREIGHTON & BLACK:** New York, N.Y. *Ca.* 1854-1856. Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1854-1856. In Boston, Mass., at 7 Congress in 1854-1855. Successors in Boston to Bliss & Creighton. Supplying chronometers.
- CREIGHTON, C. H.:** Morrow, Ohio. *Ca.* 1904. "C. H. Creighton, Morrow, Ohio 1904" written on Ohio tall clock. Repairman.
- CREMENS, DANIEL:** Baltimore, Md. *Ca.* 1867-1868. Watch finisher.
- "CRESCENT GARDEN":** Grade name used by American Watch Co. 1869-1877.
- "CRESCENT STREET":** Grade name used by American Watch Co. 1869-1877.
- CRESCENT STREET WATCH CO.:** Newark, N.J. *Ca.* 1923. This entry is suspect. It could be the Crescent Watch Case Co. at Riverside, N.J. See below.
- CRESCENT WATCH CASE CO.:** Brooklyn, N.Y. *Ca.* 1885-1904. Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1904-1923. Riverside, N.J. *Ca.* 1923 and after. Watchcase manufacturer. In 1904 the manufacturing moved to Philadelphia as the Crescent Division of the Keystone Watch Case Co. In 1923 the Philadelphia Crescent Division closed and reopened in Riverside, N.J.
- CRET, C.:** Orwigsburg, Pa. *Ca.* 1800, Tall clock.
- CREUS, BENJAMIN:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1771. Indentured servant to John Wood, he "ran away;" watchmaker. See below.
- CREUSE (CREVSE), BENJAMIN:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1771-1772. Spelled Crevse in Dec. 28, 1771, ad. Probably same man as above.
- CRISSEY:** See Dunning & Crissey.
- CRISSWELL, ISAAC:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1840.
- CRISSEY, W.:** Poughkeepsie, N.Y. *Ca.* 1858. At 209 Main St. "Watch-Jewelry-Silver-repairer." One of 3 listed on 1858 map of Dutchess County.
- CRITCHETT, JAMES:** Born 1761. Died 1849. Candia, N.H. Wood movement clocks and N.H. mirror clock's known. Ingenious mechanic, made watch movement cases and repaired watches and clocks.
- CRITTENDEN, CHARLES:** Tallmage, Ohio. *Ca.* 1830.
- CRITTENDEN, N. E.:** Cleveland, Ohio. *Ca.* 2nd quarter 19th century. White watch paper, "Watchmaker, Silversmith & Jeweller."
- CRITTENDEN, SIMEON:** Born 1796. Died 1867. Buckland and Holly, Mass. *Ca.* 1830-1835. Made curious primitive design pillar and scroll shelf clocks.
- CROCKER:** See Steele & Crocker.
- CROCKER:** See Wait & Crocker.
- CROCKER, HORACE:** Hartford, Conn. In partnership with Dan Steele in Steele & Crocker.
- CROCKER, J. R.:** Valley Falls, R.I. *Ca.* 1860s, "Clocks for toy banks."
- CROCKER, ORASMUS:** East Meriden (Bangall), Conn. *Ca.* 1831-1837. "Built a factory for making clocks." Failed. We could not find a Bangall, Conn., in the East Meriden, Conn., area; the only Bangall was in the Stamford area.
- CROCKER, W.S.:** Baltimore, Md. *Ca.* 1840-1841. Watchmaker.
- CROCKER, WILLIAM:** Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1834; New York, N.Y. *Ca.* 1840.
- CROFF, HENRY R.:** Germantown, no state, possibly Pennsylvania. *Ca.* 1840? Orange watch paper. Clock and watchmaker. Opposite the Buttonwood Inn. (Date on watch paper looks like 1840.)
- CROFS, JAMES:** Rochester, N.H. See James Cross.
- CROKER, JAMES BARCLAY:** From Dublin and London. Richmond, Va. *Ca.* 1805. Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1807. Petersburg, Va. *Ca.* 1808. Philadelphia, Pa. *Ca.* 1811. Manufactured and repaired watches, also "elegantly gilded watch cases." Supposed bad character. In March 1805 he was referred to as a swindler who clandestinely left Richmond. In 1807 advertised from his shop at 14 Marlboro St. in Boston. In October of 1811 a \$50.00 reward was posted for "apprehending a sheer swindler." He reportedly ran off from Philadelphia, leaving two wives, one of whom he married 18 months ago and another 1 month ago.
- CROKER, WILLIAMS.:** Harpers Ferry, W.Va. *Ca.* 1839-1840. Advertised that he did repair on clocks and watches; that he had long experience meriting patronage.
- CROLL, JACOB:** Montgomery Co., Pa. *Ca.* 1803. Apprentice to John Guth, *Ca.* 1803. Watchmaker.
- CROMBIE, WILLIAM:** Boston, Mass. *Ca.* 1780. Watchmaker. While Crombie was engaged in fighting the Revolutionary War at West Point, one of his customers advertised in the *Continental Journal* (May 18, 1780) complaining that he was unable to get his watch he had left for repair back from Crombie.
- CROMWELL, MOSES:** Ohio. No place. No dates. Clock.
